## Distinguished Services Engineers Lead the Way

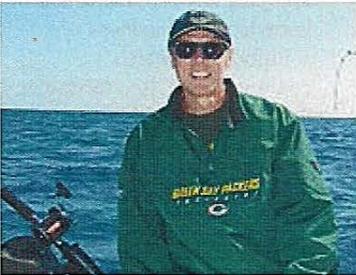

The Distinguished Services Engineer facilitates knowledge transfer, fuels technological innovation and new business solutions, and helps to shape change.

Mike Frase has most recently been providing leadership and support to CA Technical Services teams worldwide in the arena of NX-OS, the Nexus operating system.

**Five Different Paths to Engineering Distinction at Cisco**  
While the three engineers celebrated in this article have been promoted to Distinguished Services Engineer, this honor is not the only way for an engineer to become "Distinguished" at Cisco. In fact, there are five different types of engineering distinction at the company, which can sometimes prove confusing to, well, distinguish between. Here is a quick rundown of the five engineering titles that Cisco bestows:

- **Distinguished Engineer:** Approximately 50 engineers have received the designation of Distinguished Engineer at Cisco. These engineers exhibit superior leadership, responsibility, and accomplishment in technical and strategic areas critical to the success of Cisco. Candidates are evaluated in the areas of strategy and technical leadership, technical accomplishments, visibility and influence within Cisco, and industry recognition.
- **Distinguished Systems Engineer:** The Distinguished Systems Engineer program represents the Distinguished Engineer program for the Worldwide Operations organization. Little more than two dozen engineers have achieved this distinction. Distinguished Systems
